I have served in over 75 mediation/conciliation cases in disputes ranging in excess of \$650 million. Sample projects include "The Big Dig" in Boston (Co-Mediator), Dublin Port Tunnel, Dublin (Sle Conciliator), Atlantic City/Brigantine Highway, New Jersey (Sole Mediator), M50 Highway Widening, Dublin (Sole Dispute Board member).</p>
