



Highway Aesthetics



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In addition to protecting existing natural or man-made visual resources and conforming with adjacent landscapes, highway improvement projects have the potential to introduce their own positive visual impacts through proper aesthetic design.

Design quality, art and architecture are factors that CDOT considers in designing transportation improvements. Large structures such as bridges and noise walls are roadway elements that can greatly affect roadway appearance. Different designs would be appropriate for an industrial corridor as compared to a gateway into a city or a key tourist route.
