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About 150 miles west of Denver on Interstate 70, motorists drive through scenic Glenwood Canyon, a 12.5-mile stretch of highway along the Colorado River. Built from 1980 to 1992 at a cost of nearly a half billion dollars, this segment completed Interstate 70 and construction of the U.S. Interstate Highway System.

In addition to its historic nature, the Glenwood Canyon project is considered a marvel of context-sensitive engineering design. Care taken to incorporate the interstate improvements into the fragile canyon environment while leaving as much of the flora and fauna intact as possible.

Former Federal Highway Administration Administrator Thomas Larson described the Glenwood Canyon segment of I-70 as “a world-class piece of environmentally sensitive engineering” and “a scenic byway that is one of the wonders of the interstate system.”



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
