



Dyer's Woad

(*Isatis tinctoria*)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Dyer's woad acts as winter annual, biennial, or short-lived perennial that grows from 1 to 4 feet tall. The basal rosette produces stalked, bluish-green leaves covered with a fine hair. Leaves have a white mid-rib on the upper surface. The flowers are numerous, yellow and very small. They are clustered on the upper portion of multi-branched stems. Seed pods are winged and slightly pear-shaped. They change from light green to a shiny purplish-black as they mature.
