





Houndstongue

(Cynoglossum officinate)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate, contain or suppress this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Houndstongue is a short-lived perennial or biennial forb. It produces rosettes in the first year. By mid-summer of the second year, it develops a stem that is 1 to 4 feet tall. Then it flowers and produces fruit. Flowers are reddish-purple with five rounded petals. The simple leaves are oblong, with a smooth edge. Leaves are 1 to 12 inches long and 1 to 3 inches wide. The leaf tip is pointed and covered with long white hairs.
