## **Common St. Johnswort**

(*Hypericum perforatum*)

The Colorado Department of Agriculture encourages, but does not require, landowners to stop the continued spread of this invasive plant. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Common St. Johnswort is a perennial that grows 1 to 3 feet tall. Stems are rust colored and woody at the base. Leaves are characterized by prominent veins and transparent dots, visible when held up to light. The flowers are bright yellow with five petals.

Pulling should be considered as a control option only on new or small infestation sites. Repeated pulls will be necessary to ensure removal of the whole plant and any lateral roots. Check with the Colorado Department of Agriculture and local weed control authorities for herbicide recommendations.
