Colorado status: Not listed

This large, round-winged, ground-dwelling bird grows up to 30 inches long and two feet tall, weighing from two to seven pounds. It has a long, pointed tail with legs feathered to the base of the toes. Males have a large white ruff around the neck and bright yellow air sacs on their breasts, which they inflate during their mating display.

Habitat: This species is highly dependent on sagebrush for cover and food. It is found at elevations ranging from 4,000 to 9,000 feet, in 9 Colorado counties: Eagle, Garfield, Grand, Jackson, Larimer, Moffat, Rio Blanco, Routt and Summit.
