





**Uncompahgre Fritillary Butterfly

Federal status: Endangered
Colorado status: Not listed

This small butterfly has a wingspan of 1.1 to 1.4 inches. The dorsal side of the wings is dull orange-brown, with darker shading toward the wing bases, and markings that appear faded and indistinct. On the ventral side of the hind wing, the wing is dark orange-brown at base, providing a stronger contrast with the ivory white costa and ivory dash between costa and cell.
