**Dudley Bluffs Twinpod  
(Physaria obcordata)**

Federal status: Threatened  
Colorado status: Not listed

This plant is 4.8 to 7.2 inches tall with leaves 0.4 to 0.6 inches wide and 1.6 to 3.8 inches long. It has a silvery sheen due to a dense covering of overlapping, dish-shaped hairs. The flowers of this plant are yellow. They typically appear in May and June.

Habitat: This species grows on barren white outcrops and steep slopes exposed by creek downcutting. Its range is restricted to the Parachute Creek Member of the oil shale bearing Green River Formation, at elevations between 5,900 and 7,500 feet, in Rio Blanco County, Colorado.
