**Graham's Beardtongue  
(Penstemon grahamii)**

Federal status: Candidate for listing  
Colorado status: Not listed

This is an herbaceous perennial plant. Each plant has one to three stems arising from a taproot. These stems are 3 to 8 inches tall. The plant has a cluster of flowers usually of 3 to 20 flowers, although occasionally just one or two flowers are present. The color of the petals varies from light to dark lavender, or pinkish, with dark violet lines in the center.

Habitat: This species grows on talus slopes and knolls of Green River Formation shales in sparsely vegetated desert shrub and pinyon-juniper communities. It is found at elevations between 5,800 to 6,000 feet, in Utah and in Rio Blanco County, Colorado.
