HELP CDOT IDENTIFY TRANSPORTATION SOLUTIONS FOR US 6 THROUGH CLIFTON

A transportation study of US 6 between I-70B and 33 Road through Clifton is underway. The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) is leading a team to examine alternatives for transportation improvements along this important corridor. The goal of the study is to develop and screen a range of improvements to improve mobility, operations, multimodal facilities, and safety along the US 6 corridor.

CDOT needs help from residents, commuters, and business representatives to identify transportation improvements that best meet the study goals. Two Focus Groups are being formed: one with area residents, commuters, and multimodal advocates, and the other with corridor business representatives. The project team will meet with each of these groups to present improvement concepts and the initial alternatives evaluation. **This is an unique opportunity to collaborate with the project team during alternatives development and screening, helping to shape the study's recommendations with only a few hours of your time.**
