**Re: Southtech Dr. Resurfacing
City of Greenwood Village's 2013 Rejuvenator Seal Project**

This is notification that a seal coat is scheduled to be placed on **Southtech Dr from Boston St. to the Frontage Road to the west on Sunday, October 6th**. The closure and detours as shown on the map on the back will be in place from **8 am to 5 pm**.

The treatment is called a rejuvenator seal and is designed to rejuvenate the surface of the asphalt and retard future cracking caused by aging and oxidation. A sand layer will be placed on the surface to reduce tracking of the material. This sand will be swept up within 48 hours. Any material tracked onto concrete driveways will naturally weather off in 2-3 weeks.

In case of emergency, police and fire vehicles will be allowed through at all times. During the placement operations, we ask that you observe and obey all traffic control measures to ensure a safe work zone and to expedite the construction work.

If you are a Property Manager with multiple tenants in your building, or a representative of a Home Owner's Association, we ask that you forward this notice to all the tenants in your building. 
If the schedule is changed due to weather update signs will be placed along the roadway with the revised date.
